Overlooking the Parliament of Westminster, St Thomas' Hospital and the London Eye, this year's conference sought to take centre stage in the UK healthcare conversation. With more than 180 delegates, 9 industry partners and 25 leading NHS speakers, we set out to deliver an interactive and insightful agenda, whilst also covering the key challenges currently faced by our audience. However, at the very heart of this year's conference, was the patient.

Our focus was to get back to the basics of why we all do what we do. To bring human connection to a digital world. The agenda included 8 breakout sessions, in which partners, delegates and VitalHub UK representatives could explore the challenges and solutions to numerous pertinent healthcare topics.

Presentations throughout the day covered topics from enhancing discharge processes, digital transformation in the East of England, reimagining ambulance recruitment, improving discharge processes and what the healthcare sector can do to empower patients. Engagement during the Q&A session of each presentation, managed through the online platform SLIDO, showed that the event tapped into the pulse of the sector's concerns, with delegate interaction garnering up to 10 questions for most sessions.
